Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the requirements of the early years foundation stage. She explains how she will promote all areas of the curriculum and create a language-rich environment that supports children's communication skills.
- The childminder recognises the importance of gathering information about each child's starting points in development. She describes how she will use this information to assess the next steps in children's learning journey and to promote their overall development.
- The childminder demonstrates her approach to managing children's behaviour. She understands the importance of communicating with children to identify any problems they face and working together to resolve them. Additionally, the childminder emphasises the significance of respecting one another and helping children to understand the differences between right and wrong.
- The childminder understands how to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. She explains how this knowledge will enable her to collaborate with other agencies to address gaps in children's learning. The childminder also has a good understanding of how to assist children who speak English as an additional language.
- The childminder recognises the importance of fostering children's confidence and independence in preparation for school. She discusses how she will plan activities that help children to practise their physical skills and self-help abilities. For example, the childminder will encourage children to put on their own coats and shoes before going outside.
- The childminder knows how to conduct risk assessments and eliminate hazards throughout her home, including the garden when necessary. For instance, the childminder identifies that the trampoline is suitable for only one older child at a time.
- The childminder's recent training has covered safeguarding practices. She has a strong understanding of safeguarding and child protection. The childminder is well informed about contextual safeguarding concerns, including how to handle any allegations made against her or a member of her family. She is familiar with the reporting procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure understanding of how to support children's physical development. She confidently discusses the activities she will provide, which include daily use of her garden and taking children to the park. The childminder explains these activities aim to enhance children's strength and coordination.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
