Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has an understanding of the requirements and she knows how to implement these in order to promote children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands how to use observation and assessments to plan appropriate learning experiences to help children make progress.
- The childminder knows how to protect children from harm and she has clear procedures in place to follow if she has any concerns about their welfare.
- The childminder keeps up to date with statutory training and she maintains her knowledge of childcare practice through her attendance on training and workshops.
- The childminder understands the need to promote children's health and well-being. She talks about encouraging them to engage in regular exercise and providing them with healthy meals and snacks.
- The childminder has strategies in place for managing children's behaviour and helping them learn to respect and value others.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and others involved with children, in order to promote continuity in children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
