Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is very experienced in safeguarding and child protection issues. She keeps her knowledge up to date and knows precisely who to contact in the event of a concern.
- The childminder reflects carefully on her work with children at her home and in the community. She continues to study for further professional qualifications to help her to raise the quality of her care and improve outcomes for children.
- The childminder knows how to plan for children's individual needs, complete assessments of children's learning and development, and monitor their progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and any other professionals involved with children to promote their well-being and learning.
- The childminder has clear policies and procedures to support children's well-being. She has a secure understanding of how to promote healthy lifestyles and positive, confident behaviour in children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled the childminder's documentation, including policies, suitability checks and training certificates.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's knowledge and experience of safeguarding and child protection procedures.
- The inspector viewed the premises with the childminder.
- The inspector talked with the childminder about her experience as an early years practitioner.
- The inspector checked the status of the childminder's qualifications and training in paediatric first aid.
