Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has an understanding of the learning and development requirements specified in the early years foundation stage. She recognises the importance of promoting all areas of learning and providing a challenging curriculum.
- The childminder understands how to support children's physical development. She talks confidently about the activities she will provide to promote children's good health, such as eating nutritional food and engaging in activities that enhance balance, strength and coordination.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of safeguarding and child protection. She is well informed about contextual safeguarding issues and knows the reporting procedures to follow if she has any concerns about a child. This includes knowing what to do if an allegation is made against her or a member of her household. This knowledge ensures that she can keep the children safe.
- The childminder explains her approach to managing children's behaviour. She recognises the importance of establishing age-appropriate rules and boundaries. She helps children understand the consequences of their actions and guides them in distinguishing between right and wrong. Additionally, she emphasises teaching children to respect one another.
- The childminder is aware of how to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. The childminder recognises the importance of collaborating with other professionals to bridge gaps in children's learning and development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of developing children's communication skills. She discusses how she will encourage activities, such as reading stories, role play, listening to them, and providing turn-taking opportunities to enhance their language development. She knows how to support children who speak English as an additional language.
- The childminder understands the significance of tracking children's progress and sharing this information with parents. She plans to speak with parents daily about the activities their children have participated in and how they can support their children's learning at home.
- The childminder plans to take the children on outings to the local park, play centres and shopping trips for cooking activities. She aims to provide them with a variety of experiences that will enhance their knowledge and understanding of the world around them.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
