Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to provide children with a safe environment in which to play and learn. For example, all the required documentation is in place to support children's health and well-being. The childminder holds current public liability insurance and has kept up to date with current legislation. She recognises the possible signs that could indicate a child is at risk of harm and knows the reporting procedures to follow if she has any welfare concerns.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She has a secure understanding of the purpose of completing observations and assessments and monitoring children's progress. The childminder recognises the value of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to help ensure continuity and progression in children's learning and development.
- The childminder understands how children learn and explains how she will provide play activities and experiences to promote active learning. She is clear about how she will plan a wide range of opportunities to support children's learning and to help prepare them in readiness for starting nursery and school.
- The childminder discussed how she plans to help children manage their behaviour. For example, she explained how she plans to teach children about the consequences of their actions, and to consider the needs of others, to create an inclusive setting. The childminder explained how she intends to develop children's healthy lifestyles. For example, providing them with regular opportunities to be active outside in the fresh air, and to have choices of a variety of healthy snacks and meals.
- The childminder understands how to reflect on the quality of her practice in order to identify areas for further development. She was able to explain how she values and will seek the views of parents, children and others in this process.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of continued professional development to improve the quality of her provision and her teaching skills, and overall outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the areas of the home that are used when the childminder is caring for children.
- The inspector talked with the childminder about self-evaluation and how she plans to continue to make improvements.
- The inspector held a discussion with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge and skills related to the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector looked at and discussed a range of records with the childminder, including evidence of qualifications and her suitability, and that of household members.
