Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has insufficient knowledge and understanding of current safeguarding matters, such as protecting children from extreme behaviour and views. This also breaches the requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder understands the importance of undertaking risk assessments to identify hazards in the environment and her responsibility to supervise children to keep them safe.
- The childminder understands how to promote the learning and development of children. She knows how to assess and track their development, and plan for their next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals, to help provide consistency for children's learning and care.
- The childminder knows how to promote healthy lifestyles and hygiene procedures. She understands how to encourage positive behaviour and how to deal with accidents.
- The childminder understands the role of self-evaluation. She knows to gather feedback from parents to help her identify and address areas for improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and adult members of the household. She discussed safeguarding issues with the childminder and current legislation.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises that are available for childminding and discussed safety arrangements.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about how she would deliver the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder about the arrangements for working in partnership with parents and other professionals.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her practices and procedures, including the childminder's public liability insurance, paediatric first aid and qualifications. She also discussed the childminder's self-evaluation.

The childminder registered in 2014 and lives in the outskirts of Nottingham City. The childminder works with assistants. The childminding provision operates all year round from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder holds a recognised early years qualification at level 3. At the time of the inspection, there were no children in the early years age range on roll.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
