Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of how to promote children's safety. She knows what action to take if she has any concerns about a child's welfare, including risk assessing her home to reduce hazards.
- The childminder understands how children learn. She is able to assess their progress, including completing progress checks for children aged between two and three years.
- The childminder knows how to work in partnership with parents and other professionals to promote children's care, learning and development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of providing children with appropriate meals and snacks to support their health. She knows how to engage children in healthy exercise and understands children's need for rest times.
- The childminder knows how to monitor the quality of her provision. For example, she has continued to take training to support her professional development that help her make improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder, her understanding of the welfare requirements and the educational programmes.
- The inspector viewed areas that are available for use when caring for children, both inside and outdoors.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's suitability, qualifications and discussed her childminding activity since the last inspection.
