Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows her responsibilities to safeguard and protect children, and understands what to do if she has any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder provides a well-planned learning environment, inside and outside. She has a range of resources and equipment to support children's learning. The childminder understands how to monitor and assess children's development, to help her plan for their progress and prepare them for school.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents. For example, she is aware of sharing information with them to support a consistent approach and to help children settle in her care.
- The childminder understands how to support children's behaviour, such as encouraging them to respect and value each other.
- The childminder understands how to help children lead a healthy lifestyle. For example, she plans opportunities for them to spend time outside and to take part in active physical play.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans for children's learning and evaluates her practice.
- The inspector viewed a range of documentation, including evidence of suitability checks, training certificates, risk assessments and written policies.
- The inspector checked the suitability and safety of the rooms and the outside play area which are used for the care of children.
