Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder describes how she will use children's interests to support their next steps in development. She has good knowledge of how she will understand each individual child and how she plans on supporting them.
- The childminder has a well-planned environment with plenty of opportunities for children to learn, inside and outside, with a wide range of resources and equipment. She has good knowledge of child development. The childminder describes how she will assess and plan for children's individual needs and help them to make progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of what makes children unique and offers an inclusive practice through activities. She describes how she will help children to learn about different cultures and religions through a range of activities, such as cooking, reading stories and experimenting with cultural materials. The childminder has plans to further extend her resources to represent more cultural diversity and special educational needs and/or disabilities.
- The childminder has clear understanding of how to keep children safe within her premises and on outings. She explains how she will use risk assessments to assess the areas which she goes to with children. The childminder knows her responsibilities and how to keep children safe. She understands the signs and symptoms of abuse, female genital mutilation and radicalisation. The childminder keeps her safeguarding training up to date and has connections with her local authority.
- The childminder discusses the importance of parent partnership. She describes how she will keep in contact with parents through observations, termly meetings and assessments. The childminder has plans to use a platform to support her partnership with parents and build on her parent views.
- The childminder's service is ready and available to support a range of children. She works hard to develop her knowledge of special educational needs and to continuously improve her provision through a range of training.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
