Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her roles and responsibilities to safeguard children. She is aware of the reporting procedures to follow if there are concerns about children or if allegations of harm are made.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles, such as through projects about oral hygiene and by encouraging children to take regular exercise.
- The childminder holds a valid paediatric first-aid certificate and has the knowledge to respond to any accidents and emergencies that may arise.
- The childminder understands the significance of working with parents and others, particularly if children are not reaching expected developmental milestones, to help them make good progress.
- The childminder is able to reflect on and monitor her practice. She keeps up to date with changes in legislation. For example, she attends network meetings and seeks training opportunities.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

She provides care from 7am to 7pm, Monday to Friday and operates throughout the year, except for Bank holidays and the Christmas period.
