Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children safe. She knows the signs that may indicate a child is at risk of harm and she understands how to report concerns about a child's welfare. The childminder ensures household members are suitable.
- The childminder understands the importance of observing and assessing children's learning to monitor their progress. She knows how to identify what children need to learn next and to plan for their ongoing progress and readiness for school.
- The childminder knows how to support good behaviour and help children to be considerate and respectful to others.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to promote children's well-being. She is aware of the importance of providing children with healthy diets and ensuring they have daily opportunities to be active and play outdoors.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of good partnerships with parents and other professionals to fully meet the needs of all children.
- The childminder knows how to seek training opportunities to develop and build on her existing knowledge to improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector talked to the childminder about her knowledge of the learning and development requirements, including arrangements for assessing children's progress.
- The inspector sampled a range of documents, and discussed the records and policies the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of safeguarding and what she would do if she had any concerns.
- The inspector checked evidence of the qualifications of the childminder and the suitability of household members.
- The inspector looked around the childminder's home and the areas that will be used for childminding.
