

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 27 May 2026, we received information from another agency about matters relating to: safeguarding policies and procedures; concerns about children's safety and welfare; and information and record keeping.

On 8 June 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 29 June 2026:

- ensure the settings safeguarding procedures relating to existing injuries are accurately completed by staff and monitored by management so that concerns in a child's home life or elsewhere are promptly identified and referred on to relevant agencies
- ensure all staff and management receive safeguarding training to improve their knowledge of how to identify signs of possible abuse, harm and neglect at the earliest opportunity
- ensure that leaders and managers review records to ensure the safe and efficient management of the setting so that there is reassurance that children are, or have been safeguarded.

We will monitor the provider's response to ensure the actions are successfully completed. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

On 1 July 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last regulatory event. We found that the provider had not met the actions set in the welfare requirement notice. We have served another welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 2 July 2026:

- ensure that leaders and managers review records to ensure the safe and efficient management of the setting so that there is reassurance that children are, or have been safeguarded.

Actions needed by 8 July 2026:

- ensure the settings safeguarding procedures relating to existing injuries and concerns are accurately completed by staff and monitored by management so that concerns in a child's home life or elsewhere are promptly identified and referred on to relevant agencies
- ensure all staff and management receive safeguarding training so that they are confident to implement the settings safeguarding and whistle blowing procedures on an ongoing basis
- ensure staffing arrangements meet the needs of all children and ensure their safety, including making sure that staff are deployed appropriately so that they can effectively supervise children while they are eating
- ensure all staff receive induction training to help them understand their roles and responsibilities and this must include information about emergency evacuation procedures, safeguarding, child protection, and health and safety issues.

We will monitor the provider's response to ensure the actions are successfully completed.

On 3 July 2026, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. The focus of the call was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare action dated 2 July 2026. We found that the provider had reviewed safeguarding records and taken relevant action to ensure children's welfare is maintained. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
