Information about this children's home

This home provides care for one child. It is part of a small organisation.

There is a newly appointed manager who has applied to register with Ofsted.

This monitoring visit

This children's home had a three-month condition imposed in February 2022 as the child living there had moved on and there was no manager in post. A manager has now been appointed. This monitoring visit was undertaken as the provider notified Ofsted of their readiness to care for a child.

The home is a welcoming space, decorated in readiness for a child's arrival. There are sufficient staff in the organisation to enable the home to open without the need for further recruitment. These staff have continued to work with children in other homes, maintaining their skills. Staff are recruited safely.

An experienced manager has been appointed to work in the home. There are clear plans in place for reopening. The children's guide is up to date and contains information about how children can make a complaint, as well as suggestions of things to do in the local area. Leaders and managers ensure relevant risk assessments relating to fire and location are up to date. Leaders and managers identified that they had stopped visits by an independent person in error. These are now reinstated.
