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About this inspection

The purpose of this inspection is to assure children and young people, parents, the public, local authorities and government of the quality and standard of the service provided. The inspection was carried out under the Care Standards Act 2000.

Service information

Brief description of the service

This children's residential unit provides care for up to six young people of either sex aged 13 years to 18 years. The unit takes emergency placements. Placements are also available for a young person bailed or remanded by a court and family or previous placement breakdown.

Currently the service has been relocated to another residential provision. This is to allow for the building to be demolished and rebuilt. The staff, young people, all records, policies and procedures have been transferred, until the rebuild and refurbishment has been completed. The service has been inspected at its temporary site and a separate report is available.

Summary

The service, on this site has been inoperative for over one year. The registered provider has indicated that the service will not be operational for at least eight months from the date of inspection. Ofsted will make a decision about when to inspect the service and this will be at a maximum of three months after any accommodation of children and young people or services starts. A minimal number of national minimum standards and regulations have been inspected. These relate to the premises provided and the registered provider only. Should the service decide to become operational they are required to inform Ofsted of their intention before they commence providing services.

The overall quality rating is satisfactory.

The gates to the drive are locked and the building is boarded up waiting to be demolished. Representatives from the local authority are working to a target date of Spring 2010 for the rebuild to be completed. Once this has occurred, the staff, young people, the units policies, procedures and records will move back to this site from their current, temporary accommodation. Once completed they should be provided with modern, up to date facilities that will enhance outcomes.
