This monitoring visit

Ofsted carried out this monitoring visit because of concerns regarding a serious incident and to review the quality of care for foster children, the support for the foster parents, and the management of the agency's functions for decision making.

Ofsted found no regulatory breaches from this monitoring visit. The agency adhered to its safeguarding procedures throughout this incident.

The agency has reflected on this serious incident and has implemented changes to its practice. It has reviewed its arrangements for intervention and support with foster placements, as well as the processes for foster carer reassessments, after significant fostering household changes. The agency plans to implement these improved arrangements.

The registered person continues to be fit for registration and there is no change to Ofsted's judgement, made at the December 2015 full inspection, that this is a good fostering agency with outstanding features.
